The Aga, conficering that it moule regum much time to clear himfelf, and a great deal of money too, wilely refolved to have retourie to a large bribe, writh had to good an effect, that the Bashaw of Aydin immecrasely proreinted i'm as faithful a fui jed as any in the Sultan's commons. Before matters had been thus accommodated b.tween them, the Bathaw came and encamped in the neighbourhood of this city with a body of roop men; which being found very inconvenient to the inhabitants, our principal mag firates went out to pay their respects to him, and backed their representations with presents, or bribes, as they are called in some countries. M. de Peysonel, the French consul, a fo repaired to that camp on the fame account; but the consule or other rations did not think fit to do the fame.

Modrid, June 13 Mr. Keere received laft Saturday, a courier irom London, and communicated his dispatches the fame evering to the count de Carvajal. It is now presented that that m miler's negotiation is drawing towards a conclusion, and that a new treaty of commerce between the two nations

will foon to made public.

## LONDON.

Jane 28. A report having been made to the duke of Cumberland, by his order, of the truth of the petition of Hannah onell, who went by the name of James Gray, and was a marine feveral years in Fraz er's regiment, and went to the East-Incles in admiral Boscawen's squadror, his royal highnels has been p'esses to order her to be pur upon the king's list, by which she will obtain a pension of thurty pounds per annum, for her life. What is remarkable in this heroine, is, that at the battle of Ponoicherry she received twelve wounds, fix in her right arm, and five in her left, and the other in her grein; from in last of which she extracted the ball, and herself perfected the cure, in order to prevent her fex being discovered.

We are affured that the French proceed with fuch spirit in restoring their marine, that they have lately built role's than thirteen men of war, within a furprizing short time, in the sing'e port of Toulon: That they talk of vying with the hinglift fuldenly as a maritime power, and of making the French flag respected in the Mediterranean, and in the East and West Indies: Acd that they will, for the future, always have a number of men of war employed to exercise the fallors, that the court may never be at a loss to man a squadron upon the least exigency. To this project the recovery of Cape Bieton and it's cod fifthery, the share they are working themselves into the nerring fishery on the coasts of Schetland, and the flourshing flate of their West-India colonies, must greatly contribute. If it be asked, What has Great-Britain done, in the mean time, to guard against the fatal effects of this alarming progress; must not every one be obliged to answer, No-

July 12. By letters from Madrid, we find they boast, that the number of manufacturers they have received from Lancafilire, and other parts of England, amounts to no less than 550, most of whom are Papists; and that the few Protestants in that number are allowed the exercise of their religion in private, with a royal promise that they never shall be molested by

the inquisition.

Yesterday about 5 o' clock in the afternoon, there was the most violent storm of lightning, thunder, rash, and hail, that has been known here in the memory of man; in a short time all the litreets were under water, and the hail broke the sky-lights in a great many places: The gardeners grounds round London have received incredible damage; and it it was as ex-tensive as violent, the corn must be greatly injur'd. Several of the hailstones measured more than three inches about.

BOSTON.

September 47. We are informed by a person lately come from the French settlements on Hispaniola, that four thousand persons have been landed there from France this fummer; but in fo fickly a condition, that three thousand of them had died fince their landing.

Since our last, several versels are come in from Hallifax, and by them we learn, that a flip was arrived there with 400 Germamifeculers on boardy as was likewife the America man of

war from this place.

Thursday last, Monsieur Batter, a French phisician (who. as he fays, came here for religion, received 55 lather at the public whipping polt, for taking morey, goods and closibing out of a warehouse and sugar house in this town, in an unpolie manner .- As his crimes were commined at different times, to he was fentenced to receive his limpes at three different times; but being defireus to have the job over, he petitioned that he might have them all at once, which was gianted, and fo took them all at one coie. If our French doffer alcifes eis parienti to fact mart potione, we believe be will bare in Lille provider circ.

Settember 24. By Capt. Hunter from Lifbon, we have advice, that the king of Portugal cied there about eight weeks ago, which seem'd to give a great stroke to the religious there: Father Gaspard, a Jesuit, Laving been the fole director of altairs for many years, to the no small vexation of the robility; the new king feems refelv'd to take the reins of government into his own hands. — Just before Capt, Hunter fail'd, a fire broke out in one of their hospitals, which entirely defined the tame, and a church adjoining.
