Extra9 of a Letter from Petersburg, April 13, N. S.

The Arrival of three young Ladies, brought up to Town under an Escorte, makes a great Noise here, on account of the Singularity of the Cafe, which is not only extraordinary, but

us precedented.

Those Ladies, who are the Daughters of Count Douglass, Lieutenant General, to whom the Empress had just granted a Difmillion from her Service, applied to the Governor of Revel, where they refided, praying him to put them under Arrest; alleging that they had some important Things to communicare to her Imperial Majetty against their Father, which were of a treasonable Nature. The Governor did all he could to divert them from so unnatural a Design: He shewed them the Danger to which they exposed themselves and all their Family. Among other Thirgs he represented to them, that according to the Laws of the Empire, the Party that impeaches any one of a capital Crime, must undergo the Rack three Times before the l'erim accused can be put to the Torture Dat his Exhortations were fruitless; the three Ladies persitted in their Refolution, and even threatened the Governor with an Information against himself, if he any longer delayed to great their Request; is that he was forced to comply and fend them

As soon as Count Douglais heard of the shocking Proceeding of his Daughters, he immediately patted up to Town, in order to prevent, it possible, the terrible Confequences of it. Several Perions, who interest themselves in this Affair, have made Repretentations to the Emprels about it, urging in passicular a Law of the Emperor Peter the Great, which enacts. That if any Children be found to void of Duty and natural Affection, as to impeach their Parents, their Accufation shall not only be rejected, but they that be moreover teverely punished, and

then fent back to their Parents. &c.

Vie con't yet know what Effect these Representations have had, but we are affared that the Emprels has resolved to have toole Ladies examined in her Presence: In the mean while Count Douglais is put under Arreit. It is said bis three Daughters have defired to be admitted to embrace the Greek Religion. Our Sea and Land Officers are setting out successively for their respective Posts. The Fleet at Cronstadt confils of 35 Ships of the Line, and Frigates; and part of the Gallies are ordered to be equipped and victualled for three Months. Divers Orders of a private Nature have been fent to Revel, and other Cities, in Consequence of the Discoveries made by

Count Douglass's Daughters.'

Arril 25. Last Monday the following most extraordinary Affair happened at Tring in Hertfordshire; some of the Country People having entertained an Opinion that an old Man and Woman in that Town were Witches, on Account of feveral Cattle dying of the prefent Contagion, great Numbers assembled, some on Horseback and others on Foot, and went in a Body and proclaimed them as fuch, in three different Market Towns; and about four in the Afternoon returned to Tring, and demanded the supposed Witches, whom the Inhabitanis had fent to the Workhouse for Security; which the enraged Populace being informed of, went thither, and being retuded Admittance, they pulled down the greatest Part of the Workhouse, and a House acjacent; but the Master, in the mean while, baring conveyed them to the Yestry of the Church, they atterwards affembled there, obliging the Mafter of the Workhause to go with them; they took them out by Violence, and carried them two Miles from the Town, where they bound the poer inld Woman, Hands and Feet, and after beating her in a cruel and barbarque Manner, threw her into a Pond of Water, where the perithed the old Man was likewife treated in the tame Manner, but fortunately happened to survive their Cruelty. Several Persons are since taken and committed to Cullody, for fo inhuman a Proceeding; and an Enquiry is ordered to be made, by Mr. Atkinson, Coroner of the County, into the Affair, and a Jury of Gentlemen fummoned to attend at Tring on the Occasion.

May 8. Yestercay his Royal Highnels the Duke of Cumberland attended the Call of the House of Lords, when 158 Lords were present; and it is said that his Royal Highness the Duke, the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord Chancellor, Lord Prefident of the Council, Lord Privy Seal, the two Secretaries of State, the Earl of Harcourt, and the Mafter of the Rolls, are appointed as Regents to the Prince, provi-

ded his Majesty dies in his Minority.
