On motion by Mr. Lecompte, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A further additional supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers. Ordered, That Messrs. Lecompte, Dennis and Kell, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Kell delivers a petition from Christopher Hughes, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be heard by counsel at the bar of the house in support of his petition praying that the corporation of Baltimore may be compelled to fill up Quay-street, in the city of Baltimore, and to open and render passable Hughes-street in the said city; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by Mr. Dennis, the question was put, That the report of the committee on the petition of Christopher Hughes be made the order of the day for to-morrow? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Kell, the question was put, That the house adopt the following order. Ordered, That leave be given to Christopher Hughes to be heard to-morrow by counsel before this house upon the report of the committee on his petition? Determined in the negative.

The report on the memorial of Doctors Mackenzie and Smyth, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, and the question put, That the house concur therewith and assent to the resolution therein contained? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Ringgold from the committee delivers the following report: The committee to whom was referred the petition of Jacob Jeffries, of Queen-Anne's county, beg leave to report, That they have taken the same into consideration, and find that the petitioner served in the Maryland line in the revolutionary war from the year 1778 to the year 1780, when he was discharged; they therefore submit the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Jacob Jeffries, of Queen-Anne's county, late a private in the revolutionary war, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, during life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration to him for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

Mr. Hands delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Henry W. Gibbs; which was read. The report on the petition of John J. Jacobs, a revolutionary officer, was read the second time and the question put, That the house concur therewith and assent to the resolution therein contained? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Jenkins delivers a petition from Daniel Pendleton and Frederick Jenkins, of the city of Baltimore, praying relief relative to a certain tobacco note of Pile's warehouse inspection, which was placed in their hands to sell, and which hath been lost or mislaid; which was read and referred to Messrs. Jenkins, Kell and Posey.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the benefit of John M. Graw, of Baltimore county; the bill to confirm the title of John Caldwell, of Harford county, to certain lands therein mentioned; the bill for the relief John Conley of Harford county; the bill authorising John D. Henley to remove certain negroes to the state of Maryland; the bill authorising and empowering the levy court of Prince-George's county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Uriah Mitchell; the bill for the relief of Richard Gooding's two children, Sarah Gooding and James Gooding, of St. Mary's county; the bill supplementary to an act, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a bank to be called by the name of The Farmers Bank of Somerset and Worcester, and the bill to confirm the title of Hugh Quigley and John M. Greagor, of Harford county, to certain lands therein mentioned, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill authorising Edward Brown, late sheriff and collector of Kent county, to complete his collection, and the bill authorising Robert C. Lusby, sheriff of Cecil county, and Townley Robey sheriff of Charles county, to complete their collections for the years eighteen hundred and fifteen and sixteen, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. The bill to appoint Isaac Mayo, of the city of Annapolis, trustee for the sale of certain real property therein mentioned, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. And the bill authorising James Mackey, senior, and David Mackey, securities to George Lightner late sheriff and collector of Cecil county, to complete the collection of all balances due said George W. Lightner, endorsed, "will not pass." A bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road to lead from the cross roads near Richard Atton's limekiln in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones's Falls, to the city of Baltimore; and a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Levi Dukes of Caroline county, severally endorsed, passed by the senate, January 9, 1817; which were read.

Mr. Warner delivers a bill, entitled, An act for extending North-street on the east side of Jones' Falls in the city of Baltimore; which was read.
