So it was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Hager delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the market space in Hager's-Town to the west bank of Conococheague; which was read.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to repeal so much of the act, entitled, An act to encourage the destruction of crows in the several counties therein mentioned as relates to Queen-Anne's county, endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill to lay out and open a road in Harford county, and the bill to incorporate Frederick-Town, in Frederick county, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. And the bill to allow William Waller, late sheriff and collector of Somerset county, further time to complete his collection, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. A bill, entitled, An act for altering the times of holding the court of appeals and of holding the court for Talbot county, endorsed, passed by the senate January 11, 1817; and a bill, entitled, An act for opening and extending South-street in the city of Baltimore, endorsed, passed by the senate January fourteen, 1817; which were severally read. And a petition from Thomas Johnson, of Frederick county, praying relief relative to certain lots purchased by him at the sale held at Cumberland, in Allegany county, under an act of assembly for that purpose; which was read and referred to Messrs. Potts, Dennis and Taney.

On motion by Mr. Kell, Ordered, That the bill from the senate, entitled, An act for opening and extending South-street in the city of Baltimore, be referred to a committee consisting of Messrs. Kell, Warner and W. Stewart.

On motion by Mr. Hambleton, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the speedy conveyance of public letters and packets, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. Hambleton and Jenkins, together with the committee appointed on a petition relative to the same subject, be a committee to prepare and bring in the said bill.

On motion by Mr. Kell, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for certain purposes therein mentioned. Ordered, That Messrs. Kell, W. Stewart and Bradford, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising the appointment of a trustee for the sale of lot No. — of the Choptank Indian lands in Dorchester county; which was read.

Mr. Stoddert delivers a bill, entitled, An act to enlarge the bounds of Baltimore city; which was read.

Mr. Hands delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Richard Dudley of Talbot county; which was read.

Mr. Potts delivers a bill, entitled, An act to make the final discharge of trustees appointed by the chancellor or judges of the county court matter of record; which was read.

Mr. R. Dorsey delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Edmond Evans, of Anne-Arundel county; which was read.

Mr. Jenkins delivers a bill, entitled, An act to make valid a deed from Thomas Wedding and wife, of Charles county, to Elijah Moore, formerly of Charles county, but now a resident of the state of Ohio; which was read.

Mr. Causin delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act relating to sheriffs, and for other purposes; which was read.

Mr. Washington delivers a bill, entitled, An act to lay out a road in Montgomery and Anne-Arundel counties; which was read.

Mr. H. Hall delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties; which was read.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a bill, entitled, An act appointing inspectors and wood-corders, and to regulate the cording of fire-wood brought by water to the city and county of Baltimore for sale. Also a bill, entitled, An act authorising the sale of the real estate of Joseph Dodson, late of Dorchester county, deceased; which were severally read.

On motion by Mr. Taney, the following resolution was read.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed to subscribe for — shares in the Westminster, Taney-Town, and Emmitsburg turnpike road company, and to pay the amount of the shares so subscribed to the president and managers of the said turnpike road company, one-fourth of the whole sum subscribed annually, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, Ordered, That the bill, entitled, An act to enlarge the bounds of Baltimore city, be made the order of the day for Tuesday next.
