

after the word "that" in the first line of the enacting clause be stricken out for the purpose of inserting the following: "The stockholders of the Havre-de-Grace Bank shall elect annually twelve directors from among the stockholders, nine of whom at least shall be residents of Harford county, to conduct the business of the institution, who shall be eligible to be re-elected; and the president shall be elected by the directors from their own body; and that the president, with any four directors, constituting a board, are hereby empowered to transact the general business of the bank, and to regulate the manner of discounting." Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill being read throughout, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill returned to the senate.

Mr. Handy delivers a bill, entitled, An act to change and alter the mode of repairing the public roads in Worcester county; which was read.

The supplement to the act, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Harford county to levy money for building a bridge; the bill to limit the authority of the bailiff or constable of the village of Denton in Caroline county; the bill to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the market space in Hager's-town to the west bank of Conococheague, and the bill authorizing the drawing of a lottery for the purposes therein mentioned, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The resolution authorising the treasurer of the western shore to subscribe for stock in the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Baltimore, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Kell delivers a memorial from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore, praying for a law to turnpike the road from the city of Baltimore to the town of Belle-Air; which was read and referred to Messrs. Kell, Harryman and Warner.

Mr. Harryman delivers a memorial from sundry inhabitants of the eastern precincts of Baltimore, against the passage of the bill, entitled, An act to enlarge the bounds of Baltimore city; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Warner delivers a petition from the trustees of St. Peter's Free School, in the city of Baltimore, praying an extension of the time for the repayment of the loan granted to said school; which was read and referred to Messrs. Warner, Kell and W. Stewart.

Mr. W. Stewart delivers a petition from Mary Barney of the city of Baltimore, praying that certain deeds executed by her and her husband to Thomas Sweeting, and from said Sweeting to them may be declared to be effectual; which was read and referred to Messrs. W. Stewart, Lecompte and Kell.

The house proceeded to the consideration of so much of the report of the committee of grievances and courts of justice as relates to Judge Hollingsworth, and after hearing the testimony of witnesses examined at the bar of the house, on motion by Mr. Kell, the question was put, That the house adopt the following preamble and order? Whereas Judge Hollingsworth hath issued subpoenas, by authority of this house, for sundry witnesses, whose testimony he hath deposed is material and competent in his defence, all of which subpoenas are not yet returned by the officer of this house, and all those witnesses do not yet attend this house, therefore, Ordered, That the further proceeding in his case be postponed.
