The bill having been read throughout, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

The engrossed bills No. 149 to 152 inclusive, were returned to the senate.

The house according to the order of the day proceeded to the second reading of the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the scite of the Susquehanna bridge, via the Brick-meeting house, to the Wilmington and New Ark turnpike road. The bill having been read throughout, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

The report on the petition of Lewis Medley of Saint Mary's county, was read the second time, concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, An act to prevent fraudulent sales of flour and whiskey, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr Stoddert, the following resolution was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised to pay to William H. Marriott, the sum of one hundred and eighty five dollars, for military services rendered to this state during the late war, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill, entitled, An act to pay the civil list and other expenses of civil government. On motion by Mr. Duvall, the blank relative to the salary of the treasurer of the western shore was filled up with two thousand dollars.

On motion by Mr. Lecompte, the question was put, That the blank relative to the salary of the treasurer of the eastern shore be filled up with six hundred dollars? Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, the said blank was filled up with four hundred and fifty dollars.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, the blank relative to the salary of the auditor was filled up with eight hundred dollars.

The resolutions relative to runaway negroes were read the second time, amended, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the opening of Bridge-street in the eastern precincts of the city of Baltimore; the bill to incorporate the St. Andrew's Society of the city of Baltimore; the bill to shut up an old road in Cecil county, and the further additional supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill to widen a part of Bridge-street in the city of Baltimore endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
