So it was resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill authorising the extension of Pratt and Lombard streets in the city of Baltimore, and on motion by Mr. Hambleton, the question was put, That the further consideration of said bill be referred to the next general assembly? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill authorising Marsham Parker late sheriff of Calvert county to complete his collection, the bill to incorporate the trustees of the Shrewsbury academy, and the supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the speedy conveyance of public letters and packets, and for other purposes, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, An act to invest the levy court of Baltimore county with the powers now exercised by the commissioners of the tax of the city and county of Baltimore, and for other purposes, was read the second time, and the question put, Shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative, and the bill returned to the senate.

On motion by Mr. R. K. Watts, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery for the purpose of purchasing lots and erecting school houses thereon for the education of poor children in Montgomery county. Ordered, That Messrs. R. K. Watts, Watkins and Lanham, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill authorising Joseph Darden late collector of Talbot county to complete his collections; the bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne Arundel county to assess and levy the sums of money for the persons therein mentioned; the bill authorising the appointing inspectors and wood-corders and to regulate the cording of firewood brought by water to the city of Baltimore for sale; the bill for the encouragement of internal improvement, and the bill for the benefit of Mary Comegys and others, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill authorising the sale of certain property therein mentioned; and the bill authorising the justices of the levy court of Anne Arundel county to lease to Joseph J. Hopkins and Gerard R. Cowman part of a lot or parcel of land therein mentioned, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. The bill authorising the sale or leasing of the poor-house and ground belonging thereto in Baltimore county, and to provide for building a new one, and the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. A bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Potomac turnpike company, endorsed, "passed by the senate February 3, 1817;" which was read. Also a bill, entitled, An act relating to insolvent debtors in the city and county of Baltimore, endorsed, "passed by the senate February 3, 1817;" which was read the first and second time by special order and passed.

Mr. Taney delivers a bill, entitled, An act to remove the seat of government from the city of Annapolis.

On motion by Mr. Kell the following order was read.

Ordered, That the bill, entitled, An act to remove the seat of government from the city of Annapolis, be referred to the consideration of the next general assembly, and that the same be published with the votes and proceedings for the consideration of the several counties of the state.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the said order.

Mr. Dennis asked for a division of the question; the question was then put, That the house adopt the first part of the order relative to the reference of the bill? Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the house adopt the latter part of the order relative to the bill being published with the votes and proceedings? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, That the house adopt the order as amended? Resolved in the affirmative.

The house adjourns until this evening 5 o'clock.
