

liquidating the debt incurred in building the court-house, together with the law for annexing the precincts to the city, by which the county is deprived of the tax appropriated to repairing roads and building bridges, heretofore levied upon the city and precincts; under all those considerations, your committee are of opinion it would be inexpedient to tax the county for the building of the bridges as prayed for, at this time; they therefore propose that said memorials be referred to the consideration of the next general assembly.

Fauvel and Sarah Fauvel, of the city of Baltimore; a bill, entitled, An act relating to banks; a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of William Redden and Hannah Redden, of the city of Baltimore; a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of John Baer, of Henry, and Catharine Baer, of Frederick county; and a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of James H. Calder and Jane Eliza Calder of the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Thomas delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Jesse Boulden of Cecil county; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, the following resolution was read.

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorised, to direct the register of the chancery office to cause such record books as are in a state of decay belonging to the chancery office, to be secured by repairing or rebinding them, and that they draw on the treasurer for such sum or sums of money as may be necessary to carry this resolution into effect, and that the treasurer pay the same out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

The resolution relative to fitting up one of the rooms in the east wing of the public barracks in Frederick Town, for the reception and safe keeping of the field pieces of the artillery company in said town, was read the second time and assented to.

Mr. Bradford delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Josias W. Dallam of Harford county; which was read.

The report on the petition of the Susquehanna Bridge and Bank Company was read the second time, and the question put, That the house concur therewith and assent to the resolution therein contained? Determined in the negative.

The resolution in favour of the Elkton academy, was read the second time, and the question put, That the house assent thereto? Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Potts, the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of William Emmitt and James Hughes, of Frederick county, was referred to the next general assembly.

The bill to authorise Thomas Bicknell to sell the real estate of Amos Gambrill, deceased, of Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill relating to a turnpike gate in Baltimore county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill for the preservation of the breed of certain foreign animals when imported into this state, was read the second time, and the question put, Shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:
