

Whereupon Resolved, That Edward Lloyd and William Pinkney, Esqrs. be, and they are hereby declared to be, senators to represent this state in the senate of the United States.

The speaker laid before the house communications from the cashiers of the Marine Bank of Baltimore and the Bank of Westminster, agreeably to a resolution of the last session; which were read.

WEDNESDAY, December 15, 1819.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill for the relief of James Stewart and Martin Rockyfield, of Washington county, and William Deming of the city of Baltimore, and the bill to repeal certain acts therein mentioned, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Harrison presents a petition from James H. Guest of Queen-Anne's county, praying a law may pass for the division of the real estate of Susan and Mary Elliott, and Sarah H. Guest; which was read and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Wm R. Stuart and Nicholson.

Mr. Quinton presents a petition from Teakle Taylor, of Worcester county, praying he may be permitted to keep an ordinary without a license; which was read and referred to Messrs. Quinton, Riley and A. Spence.

Mr. Polk presents a petition from John Coulburn, of Somerset county, praying a deed made to him by a constable may be made valid; which was read and referred to Messrs. Polk, Dashiell and Dennis.

On motion by Mr. Spencer, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act to incorporate a company for erecting a bridge over Chester River, at Chester Town. Ordered, That Messrs. Spencer, E. Browne and James F. Browne, prepare and bring in the same.

The resolution in favour of Joseph Mankin, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Griffith presents a petition from William Robertson, of Dorchester county, praying he may be authorised to remove a slave from Virginia into this state; which was read and referred to Messrs. Griffith, Lucas and Jackson

Mr. Kennedy presents a petition from James Greenwell, of Washington county, praying for a law authorising the levy court of said county to levy a sum of money for the support of a Foundling; which was read and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Schnebly and Gabby.

On motion by Mr. Kennedy, Ordered, That all the reports that shall be made to the legislature by any of the banks of this state during the present session, be referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Wm. R. Stuart, Breckenridge, Forrest and Lecompte.

On motion by Mr. Boyle, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act for the establishment and regulation of the levy courts in the several counties of this state. Ordered, That Messrs. Boyle, Hayward and Gabby, prepare and bring in the same.

The resolution in favour of Zachariah Mills, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Wm. R. Stuart presents a petition from Henry Darden, of Queen-Anne's county, praying a further time to pay a debt due to the state; which was read and referred to Messrs. W. R. Stuart, Harrison and Nicholson.

Mr. Montgomery presents a petition from the branch pilots praying for the repeal of an act, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish pilots and regulate their fees; which was read and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Breckenridge and Blakistone.

The resolution in favour of Robert Wright, Thomas Wright and Henry Darden, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.
