

Resolved, That the senators and representatives of this state in the congress of the United States, be requested to co-operate in the passage of a law providing for the emission of a national currency, and pledging the resources of the nation to sustain its credit.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a bill, entitled, An act to make null and void the deed and contract therein mentioned; which was read.

The bill for the relief of the poor of Anne-Arundel county, being supplementary to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of the several counties therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the supplement to the act, entitled, An act to appoint trustees for the sale of the property therein mentioned, endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill for the benefit of Robert Boone, of Virginia, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. And the bill, entitled, An act to repeal certain acts therein mentioned, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read.

On motion by Mr. Kennedy, Ordered, That the bill to repeal the fourth section of an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and seventeen, entitled, An additional supplement to the act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, have a second reading on Wednesday next.

The resolution relative to printing the election laws, was read the second time and assented to.

The bill for the benefit of Teakle Taylor, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to authorise the levy court of Charles county to dispose of the property therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to authorise William A. Palmore to import and bring into this state the negro slave therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.

The bill for the benefit of Mary Franklin of Charles county, was read the second time and passed.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill, entitled, An act to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the council for the ensuing year, endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. And the bill to incorporate the Reformed and Evangelical Lutheran Church in the county of Frederick, called Saint-Mary's Church, and to supply a defect in a deed made to the same, endorsed "will not pass."

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

SATURDAY, December 18, 1819.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the benefit of Mary Franklin of Charles county; the bill to authorise William A. Palmore to import and bring into this state the negro slave therein mentioned; and the resolution relative to printing the election laws, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Marriott presents a petition from Stephen Varlow, of Cecil county, a revolutionary soldier; and Mr. Montgomery presents a petition from William Coe, of the city of Baltimore, also a revolutionary soldier; which were read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Montgomery presents a petition from Eli Hewitt and Alexander Russell, securities of John Chalmers, late sheriff of Baltimore county, praying further time to pay the balance due to the state, and that the additional nine per cent interest may not be exacted; which was read and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Brackenridge and Orrick. Also a petition from Elizabeth Kreager, praying a divorce; which was read and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Breckenridge and A. H. Price. Mr. Boyle presents a petition from John Taylor, of Anne Arundel county; and Mr. Lucas presents a petition from James Brazier, of Dorchester county, both revolutionary soldiers; which were read and referred to the committee appointed on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. F. M. Hall delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising Basil Bowling, late collector and sheriff of Prince George's county, to complete his collections, which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Patten presents a petition from sundry inhabitants of Cecil county, praying the Susquehanna Company may not be permitted to obstruct the navigation of said river; which was read and referred to Messrs. Patten, Norris, H. Hall, Breckenridge and Maulsby. Mr. Marriott presents a memorial from the board of managers of the American Colonization Society, praying pecuniary aid, which was read and referred to Messrs. Marriott, Montgomery, Jenifer, Maulsby, Lecompte, Harrison and Duvall. Mr. Montgomery presents a memorial from the constables of the city of Baltimore, praying several alterations relative to their fees; which was read and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, A. Price and Breckenridge.

Mr. Duvall delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of Abraham G. Hammond, report, that they have had his case under consideration, and are of opinion that the petitioner is not entitled to relief by the legislature of Maryland, and recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the petitioner have leave to withdraw his petition.
