

The bill to repeal the second section of an act supplementary to an act, entitled, An act to regulate lotteries, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Dorsey, the following was added to the same, "And be it enacted, That the second section of the act, entitled, An act to regulate lotteries, passed at December session eighteen hundred and seventeen, be and the same is hereby revived and declared in full force and operation."

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of William M. Beall, sheriff of Frederick county; the additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for founding an academy at Hager's-town in Washington county; and the bill extending the time for taking the bond of the sheriff of Calvert county, severally endorsed "will pass" Ordered to be engrossed A bill, entitled, An act supplementary to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor within the several counties therein mentioned, endorsed "will pass." On motion by Mr. Duvall, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to make public certain streets in the city of Annapolis. Ordered, That Messrs. Duvall, T. W. Hall and Boyle, prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Ross, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the organization and regulation of the courts of common law in this state, and for the administration of justice therein. Ordered, That Messrs. Ross, Hayward, Lecompte, Harrison and Hawkins, report the same.

Mr. Quinton reports a bill, entitled, An act to increase the allowance of the sheriff of Worcester county for keeping prisoners in jail and finding them victuals. Mr. Kennedy reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the several orphans courts in this state to appoint criers. And Mr. W. R. Stuart, reports a bill, entitled, An act to make valid a deed of manumission executed by Thomas Carter, late of Queen-Anne's county, deceased, except as relates to negro Harriett, which were severally read.
