Which was read.

The bill to make valid the title of Risdon Nicholson, and Millicent Nicholson, of Kent county, to a certain lot of land therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Breckenridge presents a petition from the stockholders of the Patapsco Manufacturing Company, praying that the president and directors may be authorised to receive additional subscriptions for stock; which was read and referred to Messrs. Breckenridge, Montgomery and A. H. Price.

On motion by Mr. Maulsby, the following resolution was read:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to George W. Bradford, of Harford county, or order, the sum of forty three pounds twelve shillings and three pence, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

On motion by Mr. Hollingsworth, the following resolution was read:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to William Wellman, of Queen Anne's county, late a private in the revolutionary war, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, during his life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the war.

The bill authorising a lottery for the benefit of the Rockville and Barn's-town Roman Catholic Congregation in Montgomery county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Montgomery reports a bill, entitled, An act relating to vagrants in the city of Baltimore. And Mr. Maulsby reports a bill, entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings in the partition of the real estate of Richard Hawkins, late of Harford county, deceased; which were severally read.

The bill to incorporate the Skipton Turnpike Company, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Ross reports a bill, entitled, A supplement, to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the organization and regulation of the courts of common law in this state, and for the administration of justice therein; which was read.

Mr. Duvall presents a petition from Lurana Gootee, of the city of Annapolis, praying for support; which was read and referred to Messrs. Duvall, T. W. Hall and Wyvill.

Mr. W. R. Stuart presents a petition from Esther Newcomb, of Queen Anne's county, praying a divorce; which was read and referred to Messrs. W. R. Stuart, Hollingsworth and Nicholson.

Mr. Maulsby presents a petition from James Billingslea, and others, of Harford county, praying remuneration for expenses and attendance in the apprehension and conviction of robbers; which was read and referred to Messrs. Maulsby, Forwood and H. Hall.
