Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Peter, the question was then put on \$600. Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Jenifer, the question was put on \$500. Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put on \$400. Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the further consideration of the said bill was referred to the next general assembly.

The resolution in favour of Abraham Ross, was read the second time and assented to.

The bill to record and make valid a deed therein mentioned was read the second time and will not pass.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, Ordered, That the bill to repeal an act compelling banks to pay specie, have a second reading on Monday next.

On motion by Mr. Montgomery, Ordered, That the bill relative to lottery commissioners, have a second reading on Monday next.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, Ordered, That the order requiring information from the treasurer, have a second reading on to-morrow.

On motion by Mr. Jenifer, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to alter and amend the act to regulate lotteries. Ordered, That Messrs. Jenifer, Stevens and Hayward, report the same.

The bill to enable Frisby Henderson and wife, to convey the lands therein mentioned, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. Ross reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Samuel S. Murray, of Frederick county; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Key, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the line of the District of Columbia, where it crosses the post road leading from George Town to Frederick Town, through Montgomery and Frederick counties, to Frederick Town. Ordered, That Messrs. Key, Peter and Forrest, report the same.

Mr. Stonestreet reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the infant children of Francis S. Manning, late of Charles county, deceased. Also a bill, entitled, An act authorising William Bruce, of Charles county, to bring into this state a negro man called Nace, and to retain him as a slave. Mr. H. Hall reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Francis E. Monks, of Harford county. Mr. Hayward reports a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of William P. Ridgaway of Talbot county. And Mr. Schnebly reports a bill for the relief of James Earengy of Washington county; which were severally read.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act respecting certain suits or actions whereon judgments may be reversed and writs of procedendo awarded. Ordered, That Messrs. Dorsey, Lecompte and Stonestreet, report the same.

Mr. Maulsby from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims delivers reports favourable to John Staples, Eleanor C. Courts, Samuel Davis, and Anthony Davis; which were read.

The bill for the relief of Elizabeth Knott, of Dorchester county, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. Breckenridge presents a petition from the property holders on East-street, praying for the removal of a brick wall on the north side thereof; which was read and referred to Messrs. Breckenridge, Duvall and Montgomery

Mr. Polk reports a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Robert Pollitt, and Eliza Pollitt, of Somerset county; which was read

The bill authorising Matthew Murray, to complete his collections, was read the second time and passed.

The bill annulling the marriage of Esther Newcomb, and George Newcomb her husband, was read the second time and passed.

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

Mr. Kennedy presents a petition from Thomas Post, sheriff of Washington county, praying to be compensated for keeping insolvent debtors; which was read and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Schnebly and Keller.

On motion by Mr. Peter, the following resolution was read the first and second time by especial order:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to pay to Sarah Tillard, widow of Lieutenant Colonel Tillard, of the Maryland line, during the revolutionary war, or her order, during life, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a captain.
