Mr. Dorsey reports a bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and seventeen, entitled, An act to impose a tax on all banks or branches thereof in the state of Maryland not chartered by the legislature; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Wyvill reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned. And Mr. Keller reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Conococheague Bank in Williamsport, in Washington county; which was read.

The bill relating to constables and supervisors bonds in Harford county and for other purposes, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill for the benefit of the children of the late William H. Dorsey, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to authorise the president and directors of the Conococheague Bank to file or otherwise dispose of the interest of the bank in the Cumberland road stock, and the bill to authorise the levy court of Harford county to levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to empower the chancellor to make such decree as to him shall seem just and right in the case therein mentioned, was read the second time, amended, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill for the benefit of William Turnbull, and the bill to prevent bullet playing in Union Town, in Frederick county, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On the second reading of the report relative to the Susquehanna Canal, on motion by Mr. Forwood, the question was put, That the following be inserted after the word effect, "they shall make a report thereof to Cecil county court, who shall select twelve men from the state at large to review the said wing-dam, and in case they shall confirm the opinion of the said commissioners that." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Forwood, the following resolution was read.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of the commissioners or men selected to act, as the case may be, to cause at least ten days notice of their intention to be set up at the office of the Susquehanna Canal Company, before they shall proceed in the execution of the powers hereby vested in them.

On motion by Mr. Stevens, the following resolution was read:—Resolved, That the governor be and he is hereby requested to transmit a copy of the foregoing resolution to the governor of Pennsylvania.

The resolutions were then assented to.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, was read the second time and will not pass, and the bill returned to the senate.

Mr. Forrest reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the University of Maryland; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate.

The report on the petition of Richard Lockerman, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put on the first part of the resolution as far as the word "therefor" inclusive? Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the house assent to the residue of the resolution? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill relating to the Surgical Institution of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

The supplement to an act relating to justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, and the question put, Shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required by Mr. Jenifer, appeared as follow:
