

## NEGATIVE.

Resolved in the affirmative.

The speaker laid before the house a communication from Judge Shriver; read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to provide for the building a bridge over Beaver Creek, in Washington county; the bill for the re-valuation of real and personal property in Cecil county; the bill for the benefit of the heirs of Mars Logan, of Harford county, deceased, and the bill to encourage the destruction of crows in Calvert county, severally endorsed, "will pass" Ordered to be engrossed. The bill to make valid two deeds therein mentioned, endorsed, "will not pass." And the resolution relative to public property, endorsed, "assented to."

On motion by Mr Nabb, ORDERED, That Thomas Jones be, and he is hereby appointed committee clerk in the place of George A. Smith, elected register of wills for Caroline county. Ordered, That he be qualified as such.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to incorporate the Baltimore Society for the encouragement of industry, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. The supplement to the act entitled, An act to provide for the organization and regulation of the courts of common law in this state, and for the administration of justice in the same, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read.

Mr. Archer reports a bill entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of the Chesapeake Academy, which was read.

On motion by Mr. Allen, ORDERED, That the bill relative to a wing dam in Su-quehannah, be recommitted for amendment.

The house adjourns until to morrow morning 9 o'clock.

## FRIDAY, JANUARY 13, 1822.

The house met. Present, the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The further supplement to the act entitled, an act regulating the inspection of tobacco, and the resolution in favor of Jehu Chandler, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Carroll presents a memorial from the president, directors and company of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, praying they may be authorised to issue two and three dollar notes; read and referred to Messrs. Carroll, Woodward and Hughes.

Mr. Marriott delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the memorial of the visitors of Anne Arundel county free school, beg leave to report, that they have had the same under their consideration and beg leave to recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Mr. Orrick reports a bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes.

Mr. Whitely reports a bill entitled, An act for the revaluation of real and personal property in Caroline county.

Mr. Pigman reports a bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers.

Mr. Sprigg reports a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of Thomas J. Perry, late of Allegany county.

Mr. Wever reports a bill entitled, An act to authorise the president and managers of the Boonsborough turnpike road company, to raise by lottery a sum of money therein named, and for other purposes.

Mr. Nicholson reports a bill entitled, An act to confirm and make valid the acts and proceedings of John Rigby as a justice of the peace for Queen Ann's county; and Mr. Millard reports a bill entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Thomas S. Ward and Ann Ward of Saint Mary's county; which were read.

On motion by Mr. Martin, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled A further supplement to an act entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes. Ordered that Messrs. Martin, T. Kemp and Loockerman, report the same.

Mr. Millard presents a petition from the directresses of the Orphan Charity School, of the city of Baltimore, praying that a law may pass extending the time of service of females to the age of eighteen: read and referred to Messrs. Millard, Kennedy, Wyatt, Semmes and Edelen.

Mr. King presents a petition from the commissioners of the town of Princess Anne, in Somerset county, praying their proceedings may be confirmed; read and referred to Messrs. King, Dennis and Balliard.
