On motion by Mr Semmes, the following resolution was read, assented to and sent to the senate: **RESOLVED**, That Aquilla Beall, clerk of Prince George's county court, be, and he is hereby released from the payment of the nine per cent per annum, of the fifteen per cent for interest chargeable on the principal due from the said Aquilla Beall to the state, on condition only, that the said Aquilla Beall shall punctually pay to the treasurer of the western shore, on or before the first day of August next, the principal sum due to the state, with interest on the same, at the rate of six per cent per annum, from the several and respective periods at which by law the same are made payable.

On motion by Mr Bruce, the following resolution was read:

Whereas, the usual salary or allowance to the printer to the state, being reduced: **Resolved**, That he shall be required to print only six hundred copies of the votes and proceedings, to be distributed in such manner as the executive may direct; and that the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, be directed to cause all laws and resolutions of a general interest to the state, to be published in such news papers, (not exceeding five) of this state, as he may deem most expedient, *Provided*, such publication can be made in each paper, for a sum not exceeding sixty dollars, and the same cause to be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

The resolution in favor of Beene S. Pigman, was read the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr Pigman the following resolution was read:

RESOLVED, That Joseph M. Cromwell, former sheriff of Frederick county, be, and he is hereby released from the payment of the nine per cent per annum of the fifteen per cent for interest chargeable on the principal sum due from the said Joseph M. Cromwell to the state, on condition only, that the said Joseph M. Cromwell shall punctually pay to the treasurer of the western shore, on or before the first day of January, eighteen hundred and twenty three, the principal sum due to the state, with interest on the same, at the rate of six per cent per annum from the several and respective periods at which by law the same are made payable.

Mr Barney presents a petition from John M. Allister and others, of the city of Baltimore, against the opening and extending North street; read and ordered to lie on the table.

The question was then put, That the house concur with the report of the committee proposing an address to his excellency the governor, for the removal from office of Judge Shriver? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
