

On motion by Mr Dennis, the third clause prohibiting justices to meet at taverns to transact business, was struck out.

On motion by Mr Bowles, Washington county was exempted from the operation of the law.

On motion by Mr Loockerman, the bill was rejected.

The additional supplement to an act entitled, An act to provide for the organization and regulation of the courts of common law in this state, and for the administration of justice therein, was read the second time.

On motion by Mr Bruce, the question was put that the following be inserted in the clause giving additional salary to the judges in the fifth judicial district, to wit: "whose residence may not be in Frederick county." Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr Forwood, the question was put that the bill be so amended as to make Frederick county pay the additional salary of the judges, instead of being paid by the treasurer.
