Which was twice read, and on motion by Mr. Loockerman, referred to the next general assembly.

On motion by Mr. Loockerman, the question was put, that the house reconsider the supplement laying duties on licenses to retailers of dry goods, and for other purposes? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Hodges reports a bill, entitled, an act relative to the making of a public landing place and road in Kent county. Mr. Allen reports a bill, entitled, An act to prevent the unnecessary accumulation of costs on suits instituted on any bond or note. Mr. Mackall reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the infant children of Robert Moore; and Mr. Stansbury reports a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the visitors of a school in Baltimore county; which were read.

The house, according to the order of the day, proceeded to the second reading of the bill to regulate executions; on motion by Mr. Saulsbury, the question was put, that the same be referred to the next general assembly? Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Pratt, the following was inserted in the clause, which provides for the valuation of property:

"I, A. B. do swear, (or affirm, as the case may be,) that I will well and truly value the property or estate of C. D. at its real value, under execution, without partiality or favor, to the best of my knowledge, so help me God."

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:
