

or neglect to become naturalized as aforesaid, such sale, conveyance or disposition, shall be as good and valid in law, as if he she or they had become naturalized agreeably to the provisions of said first section, and of the laws of the land." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Hall, the said 4th section, proposed as an amendment by Mr. Spencer, was reconsidered.

On motion by Mr. Speed, the question was put, That the same be stricken out? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, Shall the bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Eccleston obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to equalize the donations to the several colleges and academies in this state; to extend donations to such counties as have not heretofore received them, and to regulate the manner of paying said donation. Ordered, That Messrs. Eccleston, Stevens and M'Culloh, report the same.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill to withdraw the donations from the several colleges and academies in this state, for the purpose of making them part of the school fund for the several counties in which they are respectively located.

Mr. Tyson moved to strike out the following words: "and the same are hereby respectively discontinued. And be it enacted, That for the purpose of promoting education, by the establishment of schools in those counties where said colleges and academies are respectively located, the said sum of money;" for the purpose of inserting the words "withheld from said colleges and academies and."

When Mr. B. I. Jones moved to postpone the further consideration of the same to the 1st of June next? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:
