Resolved in the affirmative.

The supplementary act, entitled, An act for the recovery of small debts out of court, passed December session 1824, chap. 158, was read the second time.

On motion by Mr. Williams, the question was put, That after the words "damages under this act," in the second clause, the following be inserted: "such damages shall be appraised by two persons to be appointed by or on behalf of the parties, one to be named by each of them respectively; and in case of the refusal of one party to appoint one person as aforesaid, then both appraisers to be named by the party complaining; and in case of a disagreement of the appraisers so appointed, then the appraisers, so chosen, shall forthwith appoint an umpire, who shall have full power to decide and determine the matter in controversy."

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Stevens, the second section was then stricken out.

The bill was then passed and sent to the senate.

The house, according to the order of the day, proceeded to the second reading of the bill relative to the inspection of salted fish.

On motion by Mr. Tyson, That the preamble, to wit: "Whereas the corporation of the city of Baltimore have resisted a law passed at the last session of the legislature, relative to salted fish brought to the city of Baltimore; therefore," be stricken out?

Mr. Williams moved the following as a substitute for the preamble: "Whereas the corporation of the city of Baltimore have acted under an incorrect construction of the provisions of the act, entitled, An act relating to salted fish brought to the city of Baltimore, passed at the last session of the legislature; therefore." Determined in the negative.

The preamble was stricken out as moved by Mr. Tyson.

On motion by Mr. Howard, that the word "other" be stricken out of the words "where other articles of merchandise are usually landed and stored," for the purpose of inserting the word "such" in its place. Mr. Worthington called for a division of the question, and it was put on striking out? Determined in the negative.
