On motion by Mr. Ridgely, the report of the committee on the petition of Thomas Stallings, and others, securities of Thomas Pollard, former sheriff of Allegany county, was taken up for consideration, and the same having been read the second time, the question was put, "Will the house concur in the report, and assent to the resolution therein contained?" Resolved in the affirmative. On motion by Mr. Hope, the house agreed to reconsider said question and the decision thereon. And after considerable discussion, the question was again propounded, "Will the house concur in the report, and assent to the resolution therein contained?" Determined in the negative.

THURSDAY, January 25th, 1827.

The house met. Were present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bills passed by this house yesterday, of the following titles, were sent to the senate for concurrence, viz.

An act to establish magistrate's courts in the several counties of this state, for the trial of assaults, and assaults and batteries; and,

An act to make valid certain deeds therein mentioned.

The Speaker laid before the house a report from the sheriff of Allegany county, exhibiting a statement of the amount of fees received by him for collection, from the public officers therein mentioned, respectively, with the abatements made therefrom on account of insolvencies, and commissions allowed on his collections, for each of the years 1825 and 1826; transmitted in compliance with an order of this house of the 4th instant; referred to the committee on ways and means.
