So it was resolved in the affirmative, and the bill, being passed, was sent to the senate for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Goldsborough, the house proceeded to consider the bill reported by him, entitled, An act for the removal and prevention of obstructions to the navigation of the rivers Transquakin and Chicknamacomico, in Dorchester county; and on progression in the second reading thereof, Mr. Rauleigh moved to amend the first section of the bill, by striking therefrom the words "and wares," in the second line of that section; the question thereon being taken, it was resolved in the affirmative, and the said words were accordingly stricken out.

Mr. Goldsborough then moved, and the question was accordingly taken, that the first enacting clause of said bill be stricken out. Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill was therefore rejected.
