Whereupon, it was ordered, that the said bills and resolution be severally engrossed.

Petitions and memorials of the following titles were this day presented, viz.

By Mr. Stricker, the petition of William Sinclair, late Vice-President, and Owen Reynolds, late professor of mathematics of Baltimore College, praying redress of their grievances.

By Mr. Tyson, the petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore, praying the repeal of an act, entitled, A further supplement to an act concerning crimes and punishments. Ordered, That the said petitions be severally referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Also the petition of Michael Klinefelter and others, praying that a bill to provide a warden for the gaol of Baltimore county, may not pass; referred to the committee to whom has been referred a bill on that subject received from the senate,

And the petition of Rachel Colvin and others, praying that she may be authorised to execute deeds for certain property therein described; referred to Messrs. Tyson, Stricker and Stevens.

By Mr. Stewart, the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore city and county; also a petition from sundry inhabitants of Anne Arundel county, praying that a law may pass, authorising William Krebs of Baltimore county, and Richard Cromwell of Anne-Arundel county, to build a bridge over Patapsco river; referred to Messrs. Stewart, Speed, Kent, Tyson and Turner.

By Mr. John W. Thomas, the petition of sundry inhabitants of Cecil county, praying the patronage of the state to an asylum for the education of the deaf and dumb; referred to Messrs. J. W. Thomas, Maffitt, Tyson, Stricker and Beall. And,

By Mr. Dennis, the petition of Robert Stewart, collector of taxes for Somerset county, praying to be allowed further time to complete his collections; referred to Messrs. Dennis, Teackle and Gibbons.

Mr. Gantt asked and obtained leave to introduce a bill, to be entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the recovery of small debts, out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, passed November session 1809, chapter 76.

Ordered, That Messrs. Gantt, Stevens and Peach, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Tyson, the chairman of the committee on internal improvement, delivered the following report; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.
