

Strike out the words "or real estate of Cumberland Dugan," in the 8th line of that section of the printed bill, and insert, "lying south of Pratt-street, between Market-space dock and O'Donnell's dock."

In the 12th line 1st section, after the words "fifty nine" insert "including such portion of ground and appurtenances as the governor and council may deem necessary for a public street, or other necessary conveniences for public use, and shall, by their order, certified by the clerk of the council, direct the said commissioners to value and assess under this act."

In the 13th line 1st section, strike out the words "between the parties," and insert "as to the actual and correct worth of the land and improvements so valued and assessed."

In the 16th and 17th lines, 1st section, strike out the words, "to the said Dugan or."

In the 17th line, 1st section, after the word person, insert "or persons."

In the said 17th line after the word 'same,' insert "of which payment or offer to pay a certificate signed by a majority of the said commissioners, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore county court, or a copy of such record, certified by the clerk of said court under the seal thereof, shall be sufficient evidence."

After the word "appertaining," in the 20th line, insert, "and all right, title, estate and interest therein, at law and in equity, shall be vested in the said estate."

In the 24th line, after the word 'shall,' insert, "within thirty days after payment of the valuation being offered as aforesaid."

Add at the end of the third section, "and a copy of such record, certified by the said clerk, under the seal of his court, shall be evidence of all matters therein stated, in the same manner as certified copies of other records are evidence."

Sec. 4. In the 4th line strike out the words, "to the said Dugan or."

Add to the end of the 4th section, "and all right, title, estate and interest therein at law and in equity shall be vested in the said state," with full power nevertheless, to the governor and council to have any part thereof condemned, and used as a public street, which they may deem necessary or proper, to have so condemned, and used."

The said bill, so amended, as above was then passed.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the house proceeded to consider the bill reported by him, from the committee on
