

An act to alter the mode of appointing commissioners of the tax for Somerset county. And,

An act to appoint commissioners for the purpose of dividing Dorchester county into seven separate election districts. Severally endorsed, "will pass." Also,

An act to incorporate The Maryland Savings Institution endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments."

And, An act to exempt the Baltimore Athenium from taxation; endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment."

The amendments proposed to the two last mentioned bills were severally twice read and assented to.

Whereupon, it was ordered, that the said bills be severally engrossed. Also,

An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of lumber.

An act to provide for the printing and publication of the laws of this state.

An act to authorise Mary C. Spence, of Baltimore county, to sell the lands therein mentioned.

An act for the benefit of the creditors and family of George W. Crane, of Calvert county; and,

An act to appoint a trustee for the purposes therein mentioned; severally endorsed, "will not pass."

Also, An act to impose and collect a tax upon such parts of the estates of persons, as escape taxation under the existing laws of this state, accompanied by the following message; which was read:

And communicating a bill, originated in, and passed by the senate, entitled, An act to authorise Mary C. Spence, of Baltimore county, to sell or lease and convey the real estate of Robert T. Spence, deceased; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Buchanan, Stricker and Done.

Also, a resolution in favour of Thomas Ringgold, of Queen Anne's county, originated in, and passed by the senate; which was also read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Stevens, Tyson and Goldsborough.

And the following message, which was read:

By the Senate, March 9th, 1827.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate propose, with the concurrence of your honourable body, to appoint a joint committee of the two
