The bill from the senate, entitled, An act to legitimate Robert Delahay, Henry Delahay, the younger, and James Delahay, of Talbot county, the children of Henry Delahay, and Susan Millington, was read the third time, considered and passed without amendment.

Mr. Stevens, from the committee to whom was referred the resolution, from the senate, in favour of Thomas Ringgold, of Queen-Anne's county, reported, that the committee have had the same under consideration, and propose the rejection thereof, for the reason assigned in the following message, which was submitted, to wit:

By the House of Delegates, March 9th, 1827.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received the resolution from your house, in favour of Thomas Ringgold, of Queen-Anne's county, and are of opinion that said resolution proposes to affect the revenue of the state. This house therefore think that such a measure cannot constitutionally originate in the senate.

The said message was then twice read and agreed to; and the said resolution being also read the second, and by a special order, the third time, was dissented from.

Mr. Stevens then submitted the following resolution; which was twice read, by a special order, and assented to, viz.

By the House of Delegates, March 9th, 1827.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Queen-Anne's county court be, and hereby is authorised and empowered, to make such allowance to Thomas Ringgold, one of the securities of Nathan Betton, late sheriff of said county, against whom the said state obtained a
