

A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the more effectual protection of public worship in this state; were severally read the second time, by their respective titles, referred and recommended to the consideration of the next general assembly.

The following bills were also severally read, by their respective titles, and a further consideration thereof was referred to the next general assembly; to wit.

(On the motion of Mr. M'Culloh,) An act to provide additional means for the support and maintenance of public instruction, in primary schools, and to extend the suffrage of persons residing in the school districts of the several counties of the state.

(On the motion of Mr. Done,) An act relating to the swearing of petit jurors.

An act to abolish imprisonment for debt within this state.

An act to authorise equitable assignees to sue in their own names. And,

An act relating to the use of foreign law books, in the courts of this state.

(On the motion of Mr. Teackle,) An act relating to the treasury department, and to regulate the collection and expenditure of the public revenue of this state. And, An act concerning land warrants, and for other purposes.

(On the motion of Mr. Barnes,) An act to secure to those persons who may apprehend absconding slaves or servants, the rewards offered by their masters, mistresses or owners.

(On the motion of Mr. Gantt,) A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, passed at November session 1809, chapter 76.

(On the motion of Mr. Compton,) An act to alter the constitution and form of government, by providing that all elections by a joint vote of the general assembly of Maryland, shall be viva voce.

(On the motion of Mr. Peach,) An act relating to the inspection of tobacco, in the city of Baltimore, and to repeal parts of acts of assembly heretofore passed on that subject.

(On the motion of Mr. Montgomery,) An act relating to replevins, and for other purposes.

(On the motion of Mr. Goldsborough,) An additional supplement to an act for amending and reducing into system, the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans, and other representatives of deceased persons.

(On the motion of Mr. Wright,) A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to ascertain the allowance to sheriffs for per-
