**Registration Notice.**

To the Voters and Others of  
Queen Anne's County.

The undersigned Officers of Registration for  
the several election districts of Queen Anne's  
county hereby give notice that they will at-  
tend at the places named below, on

**Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday  
and Thursday, October  
6th, 7th, 8th and 9th, and  
Monday, October  
20th, 1890,**

(the same being designated in the Act of As-  
sembly as the October sitting).

The sitting on Monday, October 20th, will  
be only for revision and for hearing applica-  
tions for reinstatement by persons whose  
names have been stricken off.

from 5 o'clock, a. m. to 8 o'clock, p. m. of  
each of the designated days, for the purpose of  
registering the voters of said districts, as pre-  
scribed by Chapter 573, of the Acts passed by  
the General Assembly of Maryland at the  
January Session of 1890. Sections 3 and 15  
of the new law provide as follows:

Sec. 3 Each of the said officers of registra-  
tion shall have in addition to the other powers  
hereinafter conferred upon him, or which may  
be hereafter conferred upon him, by law  
during the respective times of his appointed  
sitting, the power of a justice of the peace to  
preserve order and enforce obedience to his  
lawful commands at or around his place of  
registration; to keep the access to such place  
open unobstructed; to prevent and suppress  
riots, tumult, violence and disorder, and all  
other improper practices at, around or near  
to his place of registration tending to intimi-  
dation or to the obstruction of the work of  
registration, or to the revision of the registration,  
and to protect and keep safe the registries of  
voters hereinafter referred to while in his cus-  
tody and possession; he may compel the pres-  
ence of witnesses before him while sitting as  
an officer of registration for all purposes con-  
nected with the performance of the duties of  
his office by summons and attachment; he  
may while sitting as such officer of registra-  
tion commit for trial any person committing  
at or around his place of registration any of-  
fense forbidden by this article; he shall have  
power to issue any of said summons, at-  
tachments or commitments when sitting in  
any county of this State to the sheriff of said  
county or to any constable thereof; all such  
summons shall be served by said respective of-  
ficers in the manner as if they were issued by  
a court of record having jurisdic-  
tion of the subject matter or by a justice of  
the peace exercising police powers within such  
county; the sheriff or any  
constable in this State who  
receives such summons shall receive  
therefor the same fee as it is or  
shall be for the service of reg-  
istration papers.

In compliance with the provisions of said  
Act of Assembly, the respective officers of Reg-  
istration for Queen Anne's county will meet
