**The Force Bill.**

The principal thing in President Harrison's message is a zealous recommendation that the Force bill should be taken up and pressed through Congress.

There is little need of any further argument upon this subject. This bill is simply a revolution. Its one purpose is to continue the dominant party in power; and to this end its promoters are willing to destroy local self-government, to overthrow the rights of citizens and of communities and to change a republic of free elections into a concentrated party despotism.

This scheme should be resisted determinedly, unyieldingly, uncompromisingly, by every Democrat. If necessary, every means of delay and obstruction should be resorted to in Congress. The mischiefs that are sure to arise from such a political revolution are so great and so numerous as to overshadow every other question.

Whatever differences may exist among Democrats upon other subjects, they should be forgotten and co-operation should be preserved.

The Federal election bill. To this programme two things are absolutely necessary—a change in the rules of the Senate and the presence of a constant quorum of republicans in the House as the democrats have announced their intention to oppose every one of these measures except the regular appropriation bills. There is said to be in existence a written agreement signed by 43 republican senators to change the rules and pass the election bill before the Christmas holidays.

There is one notable thing in mingling with the returning Congressmen of both parties—they all speak in most respectful terms of the claims of the Farmers Alliance, and that is a good deal more than they did when here last. Votes always command the respect of politicians.

Everybody predicts and expects that the short session of Congress which convenes next Monday will be, from one and another cause, one of the most exciting in our history, as well as one of the most important in its effect upon the political future of the three great political parties, for it is now conceded by all shrewd observers that the Farmers Alliance is one of the great political parties of the country, and that it will take a prominent part in the great national battle of 1892.

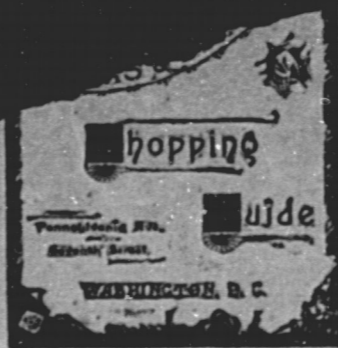
