Sheriff of Queen Anne's Co., Greeting:

Whereas, the Honorable Henry Page, did, on the eighth day of September instant, resign his seat as a Representative from the First Congressional District of Maryland in the Fifty-Second Congress of the United States.

And, whereas, the Constitution of the United States requires in such case that the Governor shall issue Writ of Election to fill the vacancy.

Now, therefore, I, Frank Brown, Governor of Maryland, do hereby order and direct that an election be held in all the counties in the said First Congressional District on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1892, for Representative from the First Congressional District of Maryland, composed of the counties of Worcester, Somerset, Wicomico, Dorchester, Talbot, Queen Anne's, Caroline and Kent, in place of the Honorable Henry Page, resigned, for the remainder of the said fifty-second Congress.

And, I do hereby order and direct that you, James E. Marshall, Esquire, Sheriff of Queen Anne's county, give not less than three weeks' notice of such election, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers published in your said county, for which this Writ of Election shall be your sufficient warrant and authority.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of Maryland, Done at the City of Annapolis, on the 14th day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
