PUBLIC LOCAL LAW.

Operative in Queen Anne's County passed at January Session of General Assembly of Maryland, Session of 1900.

CHAPTER 507.

AN ACT to provide for an Election to be held in Election District number Five, or Queenstown District of Queen Anne's County, to regulate the Liquor Traffic therein, and repealing section 193, of Article 18, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Queen Anne's County," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," as amended by the Act of 1896, Chapter 348, and re-enacting the same with the addition of certain new sections, to be designated as Sections 193 A, 193 B, 193 C, 193 D, 193 E and 193 F, so as to read as herein after provided.

SATURDAY, MAY 5th, 1900.

Section 1. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be unlawful for any person, persons or body corporate engaged in selling liquors in said district under the provisions of the preceding sections, to sell, barter, give away or otherwise dispose of any spirituous or fermented liquors or larger beer on or during the Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday, and any person violating this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon being convicted thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each offense, or by imprisonment in the house of correction for a term of not less than thirty days nor more than six months, or both, in the discretion of the court, and the license issued to such party so convicted shall be deemed forfeited from the date of such conviction.

Section 2. *And be it enacted,* That the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's County shall, at least ten days prior to the day of the holding of said election, by publishing such notice in two newspapers published in said county, and also by printed handbills to be set up at the most public places in said district, but if for any reason said notice shall not be given, or if given, shall not exactly conform to the provisions of this section, then in either event such failure shall not affect this act or operate to prevent its taking effect.

Section 3. *And be it enacted,* That the sheriff of said county shall give public notice of the holding of said election, by publishing such notice in two newspapers published in said county, and also by printed handbills to be set up at the most public places in said district, but if for any reason said notice shall not be given, or if given, shall not exactly conform to the provisions of this section, then in either event such failure shall not affect this act or operate to prevent its taking effect.

Section 4. *And be it enacted,* That the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's County shall, at least ten days prior to the day of the holding of said election, by publishing such notice in two newspapers published in said county, and also by printed handbills to be set up at the most public places in said district, but if for any reason said notice shall not be given, or if given, shall not exactly conform to the provisions of this section, then in either event such failure shall not affect this act or operate to prevent its taking effect.

It is a strange coincidence, but with the district going dry a number our citizens—whom very seldom indulge—suffered with sore (dry) throats. If this thing keeps up we fear we will not be able to take tea this summer, and we go to sea shores.

TRANSFERS AND ABATEMENTS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's County, will sit for the purpose of making orders and abatements on Tuesday, April 2nd, 10th, 17th, 24th and May 1st, and every day during the first week of the May term of court. All persons desiring abatement of present taxes or transfer of property are notified to appear at the office of the County Commissioners on the above named dates.
