"Sing in a low key" is the advice of Judge Stake, of Hagerstown, to those who would still the rise of angry passions. Has the judge lost faith in the efficacy of the time-honored expedient of counting a hundred?

South Dakota must look to its laurels in the divorce-granting industry. The filing of 37 suits for dissolution of the matrimonial tie in one day at Washington indicates the existence of a rival for the somewhat dubious honor of undoing the work of the preacher.

At Washington, N. J., a negro war veteran seventy-one years old wanted to celebrate the wind-up of the year by marrying a white girl aged twenty years. The white girl was willing; but the Jersey magistrate who was asked to perform the ceremony indignantly refused, and a hundred citizens thereupon maltreated the negro and pulled down his house.

A party of men in Tennessee recently lynched a man afterwards proved to be innocent. Now and then a mistake of this kind, owing to the ordinary hurry of lynch law, does occur, but this one has an unusual termination, though one which it is to be hoped will become common. The lynchers are now in jail under indictment for murder. Perhaps such hasty people may be induced to suspend judgment in future if a few of their sort are suspended now.

Delegate Giles, of Somerset county, will introduce in the coming session of the legislature a "Jim Crow" law as now exists in Virginia.

The legislature of Maryland organized at Annapolis, Wednesday. After electing several officers adjourned until Tuesday next.  
The message of Governor Smith was read in both houses. It is a straightforward business man's review of the public affairs of the State. His recommendations are all in the line of improvement or retrenchment of expenses. The exhibit he makes of the conditions is highly satisfactory, and where there are wrongs or imperfections he points out the remedy. The condition of the State's finances is most gratifying.

The message relating to public education will be read with more than ordinary interest. The Governor has always taken deep interest in this subject and is the author and promoter of the law for providing school books at the public expense. The present annual appropriation for this purpose is \$150,000. The Governor believes that now, since the first cost of the system has been met, the appropriation ought to be reduced to \$125,000. The act of 1900 reorganizing the county school boards, he thinks, has had the effect of eliminating politics from the schools. He recommends some change in the method of buying books and a revision of the law establishing manual training schools. Among other recommendations made by the Governor is the formation of an unpaid commission to devise some means for mitigating the ravages of consumption, the erection of an addition to the House of Correction, the expenditure of \$5,000 in spreading oyster shells in the waters of the State to hold oyster spat, and the enactment of a primary election law.

The Governor believes the election law of 1901, "has fulfilled the expectation and design of its framers in promoting independent, intelligent and discriminating voting and in rendering the ballot absolutely secret, thereby decreasing the crime of bribery and improving the moral tone of our elections." The changes in the law which the Governor recommends are such as will enable officials to declare the result more speedily and requiring uniform type throughout the State.
