The Chestertown Transcript gives the following words of praise to our progressive Board of County Commissioners:

"The proposed piece of road will include the notoriously miserable piece of mud-road along Klinefelter's woods and the not less widely-known stretch of sand road beyond. The commissioners of Queen Anne's have set apart five hundred dollars to be devoted to the work. In selecting this piece of road for the experiment, one of the worst sections of driveway in either Kent or Queen Anne's counties has been taken, and the result should be conclusive as to the merits of the material and system adopted. This action on the part of the Queen Anne's commissioners is to be most heartily commended, and it is hoped that their aggressiveness may be imitated by the commissioners of Kent and every county on the Eastern Shore. The efforts of Mr. W. Irving Walker, supplemented by the untiring energy of Mr. W. Frank Temple and the other members of the Queen Anne's board, promise splendid results which, it is hoped, may reach to this side of the Chester."

Peace has been concluded at last between Briton and Boer. On Saturday night the terms were signed at Pretoria by Representatives of the burghers and by Lord Milner and General Kitchener, acting on behalf of the British Government. The peace terms concede much to the Boers for instance, fifteen million dollars for reimbursement war losses, conditional right to bear arms and early self-government is promised. The fight which the Dutch farmers of South Africa have made for the preservation of the independence of their republics has been marked by a valor, devotion and self-sacrifice unsurpassed in the history of the world. Arrayed against them was a mighty empire, able to put hundreds of thousands of men in the field and unlimited resources in money and war material. That the Boers held out more than two years against odds was not expected by military experts—least of all by the nation which has finally succeeded in conquering the two republics. It was stated in London that a British army of 50,000 men would bring the Boers to terms in short order, while the expenses of the war would not exceed \$100,000,000. The cost of the war up to March 31 last, was more than \$800,000,000; over 500,000 soldiers had been sent to South Africa and employed in the operations to whip the Boers; the number of British soldiers killed in battle and dying from wounds and disease aggregated at least 21,000, while three times as many were "invalided home." That is what the war had cost Great Britain in men and in money up to March 31 last. In military prestige and in trade the British empire has also suffered heavily. President Kruger declared before the struggle began that it would be one which would "stagger humanity." Perhaps this has not been the case, but it is at least true that the sturdy Boers have "staggered" the British taxpayer and humiliated one of the proudest of nations.

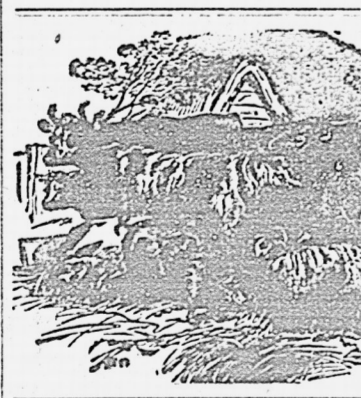

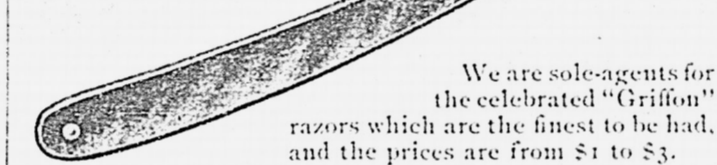
