Through some extraordinary oversight in the accounts of the last year "society event" at Newport no statement was made of the amount of money the hostess spent on the entertainment.

The reason Roosevelt insults Southern Democrats and scolds Southern Republicans is that he has made up his mind not to try to carry a single Southern State in the general election.

With the nomination of Mr. Ellender, the political battle in the First District is ready for action.

Delegates made a hard fight to laud their favorite son, Mr. P. B. Hopper, but the odds were against him and he ran against the same snag as when he was a candidate for the judgeship.

While we would have been pleased had Mr. Hopper received the nomination at the Ocean City convention, we never gave it a passing thought, as we felt sure that he had no show to pluck the plum.

If Mr. Hopper had been nominated, old Queen Anne's would have given the largest majority for many years, as he is without doubt the strongest and most popular man in the Democratic ranks in this county.

The protection newspapers of the country are seizing upon President Roosevelt's suggestion of national control of the trusts, through an amendment to the Constitution, as a drowning man grasps at a straw.

"They look upon it as a good method of apparently meeting the trust question without touching the tariff that is so precious in their eyes."

"This is what the people want; this is what the corporations do not want," shrieks the Philadelphia Press, one of the most hide-bound organs of protection.

But to others it is not so apparent how the trusts will be seriously disturbed by President Roosevelt's proposed remedy.

"Suppose that, after a long and bitter struggle, the Constitution is amended so that national sovereignty over the trusts is established. What then?" asks the Baltimore Sun.

"The trusts may still enjoy the privileges assured to them by a high tariff—a tariff which enables them to sell their products at high prices in the home market and to undersell the foreigners in the markets of Europe."

This policy, it appears, is not condemned by the party now in control of the government, and there is no reason to believe that it will be modified as long as protectionist doctrines prevail.

Must the people continue to give a bonus to the trusts for an indefinite period in order that our export trade may be built up at the expense of domestic consumers? Of what material benefit will national control of the trusts be, if our tariff is of such a nature that the combinations of capital and industry will have an unimpeded monopoly of the home market and will be able to charge domestic consumers such prices as they choose to exact?

The "national control" which President Roosevelt has in mind is a matter of the dim and distant future. What is required is some measure of immediate relief. That could be accomplished through a reduction of the tariff—a reduction which Congress can make at any time without amending the Constitution.

So long as the tariff that protects them and assures them of a monopoly of the home market is not abolished, the trusts will have no occasion for alarm. It will take years to apply the President's remedy of an amendment to the Constitution, and it is not at all certain that such an amendment would be ratified by the Legislatures of three-fourths of the States, and if it failed to receive this endorsement it would amount to nothing. But the remedy of withdrawing tariff protection may be made effective by Congress and the President in a few hours.

Will President Roosevelt be honest enough and brave enough to recommend this side remedy—this effective striking at the trusts through the tariff?

One kind of hypocrite is the man who after thanking the Lord for his dinner proceeds to find fault with the cook.

The unpleasant section of the hereafter, to specify it as mellifluous as possible, will certainly be rendered doubly distasteful to any coal baron who chances to be assigned quarters there.

He will gnash his teeth over the rash waste of fuel, and the possibilities for excessive profits if the place were conducted on a businesslike basis.

Tongues on the Oyster Bars. A large fleet of tonging boats sailed out of the creek, Monday morning and the oyster rocks of Chester and Wye rivers were dotted with hundreds of these craft.

Recent investigations have shown that the supply on the natural bars and rocks is very little if any greater than at the close of the season last spring and when tongers returned Monday they, too, reported that oysters were very scarce and that the rocks were almost barren of young growth.

The day's catch showed an average of only six bushels to a boat. This was in striking contrast to the results of a few years back, when from 20 to 30 bushels was a tonger's daily average.

The price obtained for shell stock was 40 to 50 cents per bushel.
