One person for Sheriff of Queen Anne's County.

One person for State's Attorney of Queen Anne's County.

One person for Surveyor of Queen Anne's County.

Four Delegates to represent Queen Anne's County in Democratic State Convention to be held at such time and place hereafter that shall be named by the Democratic State Central Committee to nominate

One person for the Office of Governor of Maryland,  
 One person for the Office of Comptroller of the Treasury of Maryland,

Polls will be opened from 8 A. M. to 8 P. M.

All District Delegates selected by the respective Districts to be voted for and counted by the judges at the above-called Primary Elections must be filed with the State Central Committee for Queen Anne's County, on or before Noon, Thursday, June 9th, 1903. A failure to comply with this requirement may prevent Delegates so failing or neglecting from being considered legally elected members of the Democratic County Convention.

All persons interested in the appointment of Judges and Clerks to serve in the respective Districts of said Primary Elections, are requested to meet the State Central Committee for Queen Anne's County in the Grand Jury Room of the Court House, at 1 o'clock P. M., Tuesday, June 9th, 1903, without further notice.
