papers thereof to the intendant of the revenue, by the first day of January, in the year seventeen hundred and eighty-six; such person shall forfeit one fourth of the value of the property; and if any person having possession of any such property shall voluntarily discover the same, the intendant shall have full power and authority to sell the same to such person at a reasonable price, secured to be paid to this state, and after the first day of January, seventeen hundred and eighty-six, the intendant, on waving the penalty, may direct a bill to be filed as aforesaid, against any person having possession of such property.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That an act of assembly, entitled, An act for the preservation of the breed of fish, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the twenty-fourth day of May, seventeen hundred and sixty-eight, (a) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of seven years, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act to prevent the exportation of flour not merchantable from George-town, in Frederick county, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the second day of October, seventeen hundred and seventy-one, (b) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of two years, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act to oblige infected ships and other vessels coming into this province to perform quarantine, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the first day of November, seventeen hundred and sixty-six, (c) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force until the end of the next session of assembly; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act to establish a market in Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, and to regulate the said market, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the sixteenth day of November, seventeen hundred and seventy-three, (d) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of seven years, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act for abolishing June county courts, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the twenty-third day of March, seventeen hundred and seventy-four, (e) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of seven years, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter, so as not to affect the courts directed by an act passed this session to be held in June; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act for regulating the gauging of casks in Baltimore-town, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the twenty-third day of March, seventeen hundred and seventy-four, (f) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force until the end of the next session of assembly; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act to ascertain officers fees in special courts, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the tenth day of May, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, (g) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of three years, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the sixteenth day of June, seventeen hundred and seventy-seven, (h) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of seven years, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act relating to costs in criminal cases, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the fifth day of November, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, (i) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of three years, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act to regulate public ferries, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis the fifth day of November, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, (k) be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force until the end of the next session of assembly; that another act of assembly, entitled, An act to revive and continue the act of assembly to regulate the militia, and to empower
