Pardons granted to Timothy Campbell and
of Baltimore County in the usual Form, for House breaking

Annapolis 28th December 1786.

Whereas it appears by the Petition of Andrew Denham of Baltimore County, and other papers accompanying the said Petition, that he was committed to the Goal of said County by John James Esq^r one of the Justices of Baltimore County aforesaid, on the application of a certain Captain John O'Donnell charging said Denham with stealing Tea and Cinamon, upon no other evidence than the bare assertion of Capt O'Donnell and Whereas it appears that this Suit was instituted for no other reason than that the said Denham had libelled the Ship Palas commanded by Capt O'Donnell for wages due him as third Mate & Gunner of said Ship which he could not obtain by any other means - I have therefore thought proper to order and direct that all Proceedings at Law against the said Andrew Denham for or concerning the said Offence do cease and determine, and that no further Prosecution be had or carried on against him for or concerning the same.
