now all persons upon it notwithstanding, that I have and give, and
 by and license to Thomas Cornwallis Esq. and out of the Cornwallis
 to trade with any of the Indians of the Province for some
 months, and the said to other and to any of the inhabitants of
 the Province, and no further or otherwise, the license to endure until the
 first of the contrary. In witness whereof I have signed with my hand and
 the 30th of December 1637.
