immediatly you attend or cause to be attended the persons of George Bull
Thomas Smith and Edward Beckler of the free of Kent planters
and you to bring in safe conduct without bail or mainprize, and
to take you before me at St. Maries wth all reasons shal be to
answer the severall points of petition, prayer and supplication w^{ch} shall
on the Lord Proprietors behalf be offered against you respectively and
for the doing the same a warrant. Given at St. Maries the 10th day of

w^{ch} to Capt: Evelin; touching
the general Assembly.

After my hearty commendations be whereas my dear brother the Lord Pro
prietor of the Province of the Commissioners to me directed in that behalf
bearing date at London in the Kingdom of England, the 25th day of October
1637. appointed a general Assembly of all the freemen of the Province to
be held at the town of St. Maries the 20th day of January
next. Ye are therefore in the Lord's name to will and require you
(all of you the said party) to make your general repairs to the port of St. Maries
on the said 20th day of January you and yours to consult and
advise of the affairs of the Province. And further to will and require you
at such convenient time upon you shall seem fit within 5. daies after the
receipt hereof at the furthest, to assemble all the freemen inhabiting within
any part of the jurisdiction: and you and yours to publish and proclaim the
said general Assembly; and to order about the said party and the many of the
said freemen as you shall think fit to require specially to the said Assembly at
the time to be appointed; and to give full power and authority to all the said
the said freemen either to be put at the said Assembly if by the pleasure of the
said to elect and nominate such and so many persons as they shall see most
of them so assembled shall agree upon to be the deputies or assistants for the said
freemen, in their name and part to advise and consult the said things as shall
be brought into deliberation in the said Assembly; and to deliver all the petition
or supplication upon record; and the record thereof and of whatsoever you shall see in
any the premises to bring along with you, and exhibit it at the day and place
appointed to be the day of the Province for the time being. And for the doing
the same a warrant Given at St. Maries the 25th day of January 1637.
