Ordered, That the western Shore Treasurer pay to James Berry as Soldier in late Captain Keagy's Company four Pounds, twelve shillings, and eight Pence for his last year's Cheathing. —

That the said Treasurer pay to James Davis twenty seven shillings, for Part of his Cheathing last year. —

Richard Sprigg Esquire Chancellor qualified before the Governor by taking the several Oaths provided by the Constitution and Form of Government, and directed by the General Assembly, whereupon the Great Seal of the State was delivered him.

April 22^d 1777. —

Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to John M^r. Factor five hundred Pounds, on Account by order of the General Assembly. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Lt. Col^o. Benjamin Ford, for the use of the 5th Regiment, three thousand Dollars, on Acc^t. —

Charance granted to Daniel Keagy Captain of the Schooner Fortune to go to Hispaniola. —

Ordered, That the western Shore Treasurer pay to Lieut^o. Colonel Patrick Sim for the use of the 5th Regiment one thousand Dollars.

April 23^d 1777. —

Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to Captain John Davich one hundred Pounds, on Acc^t. —
