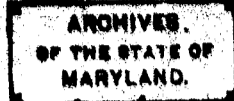


On the second Monday in November and thirtieth Day of the same Month, the General Assembly of Maryland, agreeable to the Constitution and Form of Government provided to the choice of a Governor and Thomas Sim Lee Esquire was unanimously re-elected. His Excellency was Qualified in presence of both Houses of the Legislature by taking, repeating and subscribing the several Oaths required and making and subscribing a Declaration of his Belief in the Christian Religion.



Tuesday following the 14th Day of November The General Assembly made choice of the following Gentlemen as Council to the Governor. The Honorable Daniel Carroll, James Brice, John M. Stone, Jeremiah T. Chase and Samuel T. Wright Esquires.

Wednesday 15th November 1700

Daniel Carroll and James Brice Esquires appeared and produced certificates of their Qualification and took their Seats accordingly.

Thursday 16th November 1700

John M. Stone and Jeremiah T. Chase Esquires elected Members of the Council to the Governor attended, produced certificates of their Qualification and took their Seats.

This Board have purchased of Capt William Richardson one hundred and eighty seven Bushels of County made Salt at ninety Pounds per Bushel.

Ordered that the King's Commissaries of this State furnish Captain Edward West a British Prisoner of War on his way to Philadelphia for the purpose of being Exchanged with Prisoners.

Friday 17th November 1700

Permission granted to William Dunster of Queen Anne's County to solicit Leave from His Excellency General Washington to go into New York for the purpose of obtaining a Passage to Great Britain.

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Hannah May Two Dollars of the new Emission in lieu of seventy five Pounds due her per Acct. papered by the Depts. Aud.

That the said Treasurer pay to Jonathan Parker Six hundred Pounds due him per Acct. papered by the Aud. Genl.

That the said Treasurer pay to Eli Williams Two thousand nine hundred Pounds and one hundred and fifty Pounds of the new Emission to be delivered over to Doct. Henry Schreveling Contractor for Stoves &c in Washington County on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to His Excellency Thomas Sim Lee Esquire One hundred Pounds of the new Emission on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to Captain John Rindolph Six hundred and thirty Pounds due him per Account papered by the Aud. Genl.

That the said Treasurer pay to Sgt. John Dancy Thirty seven Lbs. of Tobacco weighing thirty three thousand, one hundred and twelve Pounds at Fifty Pounds & four pence.

That the said Treasurer pay to Jonathan Parker Two Pounds and Eight pence of the new Emission in lieu of Eighty one Pounds seven shillings and six Pence due him per Account papered by the Depts. Aud.

That the said Treasurer pay to David Pod Esq. Twenty one Pounds, five shillings and three pence in lieu of Eighty one Pounds, five shillings for the use of ...
... Pounds in lieu of Three hundred & sixty Pounds for the use of Gilbert Jackson & Co.
