Monday February the 9th 1818

The council met Present His Excellency the Governor and the Honorable Daniel Murray, John E. Howard Junior, and Henry A. Ballis

By the Petition of Sarah Scott of the city of Baltimore, accompanied by a Transcript from the proceedings of Baltimore City Court, it appears that she was fined by the said Court at March Term eighteen hundred and seventeen, in two cases the sum of sixteen dollars in each case for selling spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioner states that at the time she sold the said liquors, she was under the impression, that her husband had a licence to sell. That he has left her with a number of small children to support, and that she has no way of doing so but by her labour. The Board on consideration of which circumstances, and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County, do remit the said fines.
