The Council met

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor Frederick  
St. Anns was appointed with the consent of the Council appointee Major  
of the Extra Battalion of the Militia of this State in Harford County.

A communication was received from Dock Joseph Kent one of the  
Representatives from this State in the Congress of the United States covering a  
copy of a report to the Senate of the United States and a Bill authorizing  
a liquidation of the claim of the State of Virginia against the United  
States for interest on money expended by the said State in behalf of the  
United States during the late war, offering his services in bringing  
before Congress any similar claim that it may be proper to make in  
behalf of this State. Which upon consideration was transmitted to John  
Leedy Kerr Esq. late Agent of this State for the settlement of its claim  
against the United States for expenditures during the late war with a  
request for such information upon the subject as his intimate acquaintance  
therewith enables him to afford, which is transmitted accordingly.

A communication was received from the Director of the  
Maryland Penitentiary accompanied by the annual abstracts of their  
proceedings required by Law, which was transmitted to The Honble the  
President of the Senate and The Honble the Speaker of the House of  
the House of Delegates with a message.

By the petition of George Buckler accompanied by a transcript from the  
proceedings of St. Marys County Court it appears that he was fined by the said Court  
at August Term 1824 the sum of sixteen Dollars for retailing liquor without  
license, which fine he prays may be remitted, and the Court having recommended  
the remission, the Board do hereby remit the said fine. Robt Hatcher
