

March 29th 1830.

His Excellency the Governor granted a pardon, to Richard Chub
al. Sub. convicted of "Felony" on Indictment in Baltimore City Court
at February Term 1829. (see pardon records)

His Excellency the Governor also this day, granted a pardon
to John Peck, convicted of Felony by same Court at same Term.

Also a pardon to Lewis Moore, convicted by same Court at
said Term of Felony. (see pardon records)

April 1. -

His Excellency the Governor this day appointed John
Spear Nicholas Esq. of the City of Baltimore, and John Gale
Esq. of Somerset County, his Aids de Camp, with the
title of "Colonel".

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle pro-
sequit to John Newell of Prince Georges County, for having in
his possession $\frac{3}{4}$ yds of cloth, supposed to have been stolen.
(see pardon records).

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore, pay
to the order of David Ridgely State Librarian, One hundred
dollars, for one quarters salary due this day. -

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay
to the order of Henry Thompson, Messenger to the Executive
One hundred dollars for one quarters salary, due this day.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore pay
to the order of William Brown Esq. of New. Executive General for the
Western Shore, Fifty eight dollars, thirty two Cents, it being the
balance of one quarters salary, due this day after deducting the
Fees received by him: as per his acct. allowed.
Commission issued to John H. Neff as auctioneer for the City of Baltimore

April 2.

Ordered that the Treasurer for the Western Shore, pay to
the order of Washington G. Fuch, Five dollars, for repairs at the
Government House, as per his account allowed.
