City of Baltimore. Now therefore, I James Thomas Governor of the
State of Maryland, do hereby, require and enjoin all persons within
this State, to let the said Peter P. Runyon agent as aforesaid, pass with
the said fugitive unmolested to the said State of New Jersey, he the
said agent conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner, and
using no improper, severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay
David Ridgely or order ten dollars for one years subscription to
the Law Library, by order of the Joint Library Committee, by
Certificate of the Librarian, in virtue of a Resolution of the General
Assembly.

Upon application being made to His Excellency the
Governor, by Thomas F. Bowie Esquire, Deputy Attorney General
of the State of Maryland, stating that a young Gentleman by
the name of Henry Fawcett Jr had been committed to the Jail
of Prince Georges County charged with the murder of Joseph Brown,
that the Grand Jury had been discharged and that the Court
(then in session) had refused to call them together again for the
purpose of examining the circumstances connected with the said
charge, and that no trial could be held, at the then term without
the call of a Special Court for that purpose, and that the
purposes of Justice require the call of such Special Court
His Excellency thereupon issued a Special Commission of Oyer, Terminer
and General Jail delivery, directed to the Honorable John A. Stephens
Chief Judge, and the Honorable Edmund Key and Clement
Dorsey, associate Judges, of the first Judicial District of this
State, authorizing and requiring them to hold a Court at Upper
Marlborough in the said County, on Tuesday the first day of
December next, and from thence by adjournment from day to day
