

Errata - Omissions.

November 14th. 1851.

The Governor refused to grant the application for a Nolle Prosequi in case of Theodore R. Lockerman Jr. indicted for a riotous attack upon a certain house in Easton, Talbot Co.

October 12. 1852

The Governor this day granted a pardon to John Evans, convicted in the Criminal Court of Baltimore City of an assault with intent to kill. See Pardon Book.

November 4th. 1852.

The Governor this day granted a pardon to Joseph Jewell, convicted in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County of an assault and battery. See Pardon Book.

November 9th, 1852

The Governor this day issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Anne Arundel County, commanding him to execute the sentence of death upon a certain David Johnson, a slave, imposed by the Circuit Court for said County, and to said slave to hang at or before the hour of one on Friday the 7th of January next succeeding.

November 15th. 1852

The Governor this day granted a pardon to Edward W. Faulkner convicted in the Circuit Court for (Dorchester County of an assault with intent to kill. See Pardon Book.

November 22^d. 1852

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Edward S. Richardson of Baltimore City, for selling and issuing policies of insurance without license. See Pardon Book.

December 4th.

The Governor this day received the Report of Otho Scott & James M. Buchanan Esquires, the Commissioners appointed in virtue of a Resolution of the General Assembly, 1852, to investigate the circumstances connected with the killing of a fugitive slave in the State of Pennsylvania by Archibald G. Ridgely, a citizen of Maryland; which Report stated that upon a proper consideration of all the facts and circumstances the Governor of Pennsylvania was satisfied that the homicide was an intentional, but accidental; and that the Governor would not therefore make any demand for the surrender of the said Ridgely, as a fugitive from justice - See Record Book.
