

No location of the canal and works, situated between the basin at Rock Creek and that at the mouth of the Tyber, having yet been made, no further estimate of the cost has been made than that presented to the meeting in September last, which amounted to \$18,226 80.

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By the Senate, March 14, 1829.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it was not contemplated by the General Assembly of this state, when a charter was granted to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, that any power to pass the said canal through any part of the District of Columbia, below the head of tide-water, where locks could be conveniently and properly located, was vested in said company. And that the General Assembly will view with distrust, and will not sanction an attempt upon the part of said company to expend any part of its funds in constructing a canal along the margin of tide-water, on the Potomac river, and that such expenditure will be especially improper and unwise, before the canal shall be completed from the head of tide water to the western termination of the eastern section of said canal, when only it can be done by the consent of the sovereignties by whose will the said charter was granted.
