

Extract of a Letter from J. Stull Esq. Treasurer of the Washington Turnpike Road Company, to A. Lee, Esq. Chairman of the Committee on Internal Improvement.

"The Washington Turnpike Road, a distance of a small fraction over 12 miles cost, the sum of \$46,178 49.

The Tolls received, at the gates, for the last year ending 30th December last, amounted to the sum of \$4,279 19, and about \$300 due, but not then received.

The dividend for the first half of the year ending 30th Oct. last was at the rate of six, and for the last half year, at the rate of 8 per cent per annum, though it is not probable that the next *half yearly* dividend, will increase 3 per cent for that period, neither is it probable that the dividends will materially vary from that rate, (6 per cent per annum) without some unforeseen, or unexpected event. The road is in good order, but will no doubt require more than ordinary repairs in the Spring and Summer, in consequence of the unusually heavy rains, during the fall and the severity of the winter."
