REPORT OF THE TREASURER OF THE W. SHORE

January 16th, 1839.

Read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

BY THE COMMITTEE OF CLAIMS.

Your Committee report that they have examined the proceedings and documents of George Mackubin, Treasurer of the Western Shore of Maryland, and find from an account settled to 1st Dec. 1837, by the Committee of Claims of the last General Assembly, there then remained in the Treasury, eighty thousand three hundred and sixty four dollars and fifty two cents.

That it appears to your Committee, by the accounts of the said Treasurer, he has received from 1st Dec. 1837, to 1st Dec. 1838, \$875,948 94 cents, viz:—on account of
