Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the rules and regulations for the government of the Maryland Penitentiary, submitted by the board of directors thereof, in their last annual report, dated 19th December, 1839, pursuant to act of Assembly of December session, 1837, chapter 320, be and the same are hereby confirmed.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to the directors of the Maryland Penitentiary, the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, to be taken out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the said sum to be applied by the directors towards the payment of the expenses and carrying on the business operations of said institution.
